FREEDOM2CHOOSE PROGRAMME

This project was a programme of skills training, social activities and peer mentoring. The training programme and mentoring focused on practical life skills and building emotional resilience with social activities held in a mainstream youth club. The project was supportive but beneficiaries directed their own progress. The project beneficiaries were young people aged 13-24 who have physical disabilities and additional needs.

The group was a combination of those who have left education in the past 5 years and those who are due to leave within the next 3 years. Autonomie's management committee plans to continue this work and expand it beyond Greater Belfast area to reach the other potential beneficiaries that we have clearly identified. We intend to achieve this through our own fundraising activities and by raising dedicated funds from other funders. The programme ends in June 2016, and we received great feedback from the participants and their families, a further programme is starting in early September 2016.
